Safe Schools

In Case of an Emergency

In case of an emergency, the school may need to contact parents. For this reason, it is imperative that you report any and all changes in your home, work or cell phone numbers and e-mail addresses as soon as possible to the office. It is also just as important to keep "emergency contacts" up to date.

Dress for the Weather

Please make sure your child is dressed for the weather. The children should plan on going outdoors for recesses except in extreme conditions. In these cases, indoor recesses and lunch hours will be necessary. Please remember to have all clothing labeled with your child's name.



Extra Clothes

We would like to encourage all students to bring an extra set of clothes to school in case of an accident, (wet clothing due to falling at recess or a lunch accident). If you know that your child is prone to spilling or getting dirty when playing, this may save you from having to make an extra trip to school. Your child can leave a change of clothing in their back pack.

Morning Kiss And Ride Procedures

At Julie Payette Public School, student safety is our priorityArrive early. Kiss and Ride runs from 7:45 a.m. – 8:00 a.m. Please follow these rules when using our Kiss and Ride.

- Drive slowly and with caution in the Kiss and Ride and parking lot.
- Pull up as far as you can in the Kiss and Ride lane to maximize the number of cars dropping off at one time. Have your child ready to exit the vehicle.
- Stay in your vehicle at all times. Parking in the Kiss and Ride drop off lane is not permitted.
- Adults are available to assist Kindergarten students travelling from the Kiss and Ride area to their yard.
- Students must exit the vehicle using the passenger side doors only.
- To keep things moving, have backpacks, lunch bags, snowpants, etc. in the vehicle, not the trunk.
- Students must be able to exit the vehicle independently.
- If your child requires assistance or is upset, please park your vehicle off-site and walk your child to the yard.
- ❖ When leaving the drop off lane, do so promptly by merging safely into the second lane.
- Obey the stop sign when exiting the parking lot and be extremely cautious of pedestrians.
- Follow the directions from staff on duty in the parking lot.
- Respect staff, students, volunteers, and other drivers. Our goal is to enhance student safety. Thank you in advance for your co-operation!
- Please avoid stopping at the corner of the second crosswalk as that causes congestion.

Your willingness to follow the rules is a very powerful message for all the little eyes and ears that are present at the beginning of the day. Please help us keep all JPPS students safe.

If you use the Kiss and Ride every morning, or even once in a while, please consider volunteering a few mornings to keep this program working. The job requires about 15 minutes at a time. Anyone interested in volunteering is asked to contact the school office at (905) 668-2225.
